Huge Catches of Redfish from New England Are Eaten Yearly in Midwest and South

Known also as rosefish, they are seldom used by New Englanders, more accustomed to other kinds. Formerly liscarded for lack of demand, redfish now are marketed as frozen fillets; less edible parts are made into fish neal. Increased redfish catch in recent years helped make Gloucester the leading fishing port of New England.
